If that sounds like you, we want to hear from you!



One of the most encouraging signs of the progress we've made is the continued improvement of KOMAN Holdings' Workers Compensation Experience Modification Rate (EMR).

Following a recent third-party audit of our subsidiaries, we are pleased to report that **our EMR has improved once again**—dropping from 0.76 in 2023 to 0.72 in 2024, and now an impressive **0.68 for 2025**—well below the industry standard.

This EMR reduction isn't just a number. It's a reflection of our unwavering commitment to safety. A lower EMR reinforces our reputation with potential clients, and ensures our eligibility for government contracts.

It's also a testament to the dedication of our Safety Department and a company-wide culture of workplace safety!

Improving our EMR is just one example of how we're diligently working behind the scenes to support the Board's three-year strategic priorities:

Shareholder portal offerings, redesigning our website, increasing our social media, and using email more for communication.


We're also encouraging our Shareholders to get their stock wills on file. This ensures your legacy and future generations are protected.

honor of Walter
Sargent, Jr.

Walter was born May 22, 1937 in Juneau, Alaska to parents Jennie Heitman and Walter Sargent Sr.

In 1959, Walter enlisted in the US Army so he could

serve his country and travel. By doing so, he became the first Alaskan Native to enlist in the U.S. Military Regular Army (RA) voluntarily and without being drafted.

Walter went on to become a paratrooper in the elite 101st Airborne Division—the Screaming Eagles.

Many people spoke of Walter as a man who never left an opportunity unexplored. During his enlistment in the military, he spent time skiing in Germany, enjoying fine dining in Europe, and golfing in the south of France.


Walter recalled "Being a young, handsome, Alaskan on the Ski Patrol of a first-class European Resort was a ticket to Paradise!" Upon returning to Alaska, and his beloved Kodiak Island, Walter once again

> reconnected to the sea as a commercial fisherman.

On May 27, 2023, just five days after his 86th birthday, Walter passed away peacefully gazing out over the ocean he loved so well.

> both good and bad; you consistently reach out to help others, and you know that love is the center of everything.


"This scholarship is a way to honor Walter and to give back," said the NOK Scholarship
